This is the gripping start to a new historical mystery series, introducing brother-and-sister sleuths Johan and Sonja Ryer.



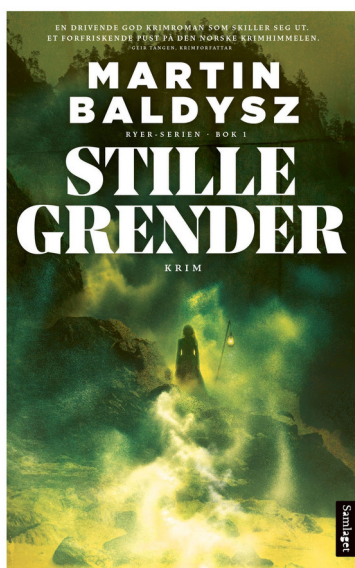
