Daggi's past experiences both disturb and form his new life.

Once again, Harald Rosenløw Eeg spellbinds the reader with his language in this incredibly engaging story about the vulnerability of a love-starved boy, Daggi. This is a story that unfolds with all the excitement of a thriller.


