Would you like to get to know the arctic fox?

The arctic fox has lived in Scandinavia longer than us humans. It is perfectly adapted to live where it is cold and there is hardly anything to eat. There used to be thousands of arctic foxes in the Scandinavian mountains, but now there are only about a few hundreds left.

In this book you can follow the arctic fox through a whole year. You will learn about the place where they live, and the challenges it faces. The arctic fox in Scandinavia is at risk of disappearing altogether. You will learn about what we humans are doing to try and save it.

Meet the Arctic Fox is an illustrated picture book, suitable for children aged 5 to 10 years. The book has two parts; the first part is full illustrated with easy to read text, while the last part is a factual text with details on both the arctic fox and conservation of species in general.

The book is fully illustrated by Inger Lise Belsvik.

She has received the Norwegian Department of Culture's Illustrator prize twice for her work and several prizes in the annual contest "The most beautiful books of the year". Her work has also been shown at a number of exhibitions over the years. Belsvik gives lectures and workshops in illustration, both for adults and children.
