Signe Marie "Zinken" Hopp (9 January 1905 – 3 September 1987) was a Norwegian author, poet and playwright. She is known for translating Lewis Carroll's Alice in Wonderland into Norwegian. Her own books, which were mostly for children, include *The Magic Chalk, Jon and Sofus* and over a dozen others. She is best known for writing children's books, and for her cheerful poems. She was also writing biographies.
