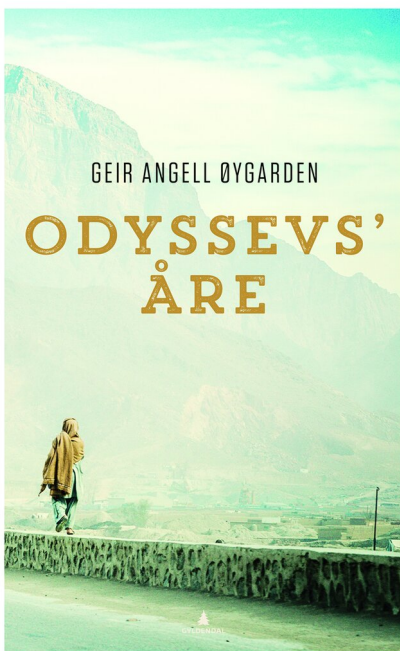

These eternal themes are explored in a remarkable cross-referencing of history, mythology and literature as Øygarden forges deeper into one of the world's most dangerous lands.

Geir Angell Øygarden was born in 1968 and lives in Glemmingebro, Sweden. He received his doctorate from Uppsala University in 2000 with a thesis on boxing. His book *Bagdad Indigo (Baghdad Indigo)* was published by Pelikanen Forlag in 2011.
