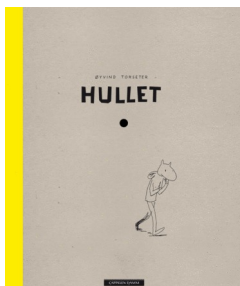
### Tails Throughout Time (Halens historie)

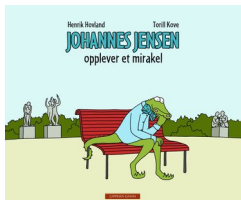

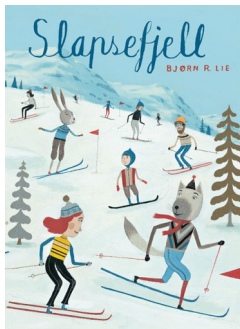

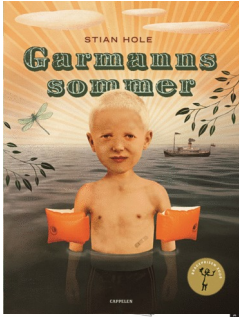
