Janne is comfort eating and cutting herself off from others, but suddenly her parents suggest a solution to the problem: For every kilo she loses, she'll get 100 kroner. Janne goes along with the agreement and slowly but surely, she gets smaller. But does she get any happier? And does it solve her real problems?

What Happened to You? is a powerful, brave and thought-provoking graphic novel about friendship, being an outsider and living with eating disorders. Jenny Jordahl delivers an important and absorbing story for children and young people aged 9 and older.

The book is a collection of comic strips about climate and the environment.

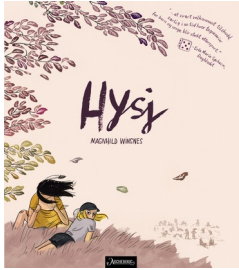

YA Graphic Novel | Aschehoug | 2017 | 368 pages

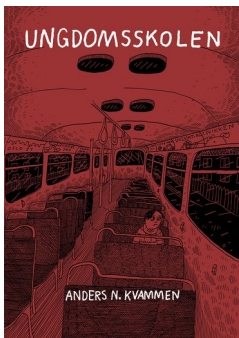
Beautiful, humourous and sensitive story about secrets.

Young Adult Graphic Novel | No Comprendo Press | 2016 | 126 pages

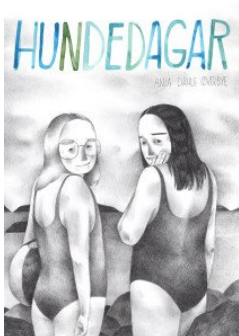
