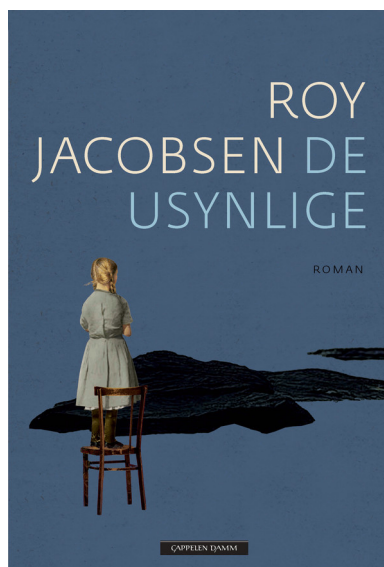

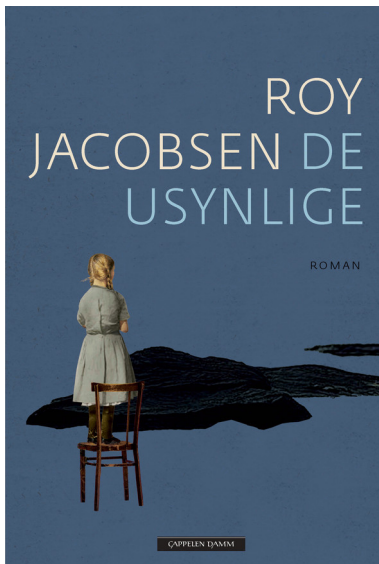

Still, there is plenty of light here, even humor. The family's love for their environment is brilliantly communicated. A life somewhere else is unthinkable to them. This is their paradise on Earth.

The family's daily work is a balancing act between refining the riches that wild nature so generously offers, and surviving in the very same wild nature that takes lives.

*The Invisible* was sold to six countries prior to publication, and went straight to the bestseller list, 5th place first week, 1st place second week. It has received fantastic reviews, and was chosen the book of the month in Bestselgerklubben (major book club).
