William is a depressed biologist and seed merchant in England 1852. Now he sets out to build a wholly new type of beehive, which will give him and his children honour and fame. George is a beekeeper in the USA in 2007 and fighting an uphill battle, but he hopes that his son can be the farm's salvation. Tao works with hand pollination in China in the future, where the bees have disappeared. She wants more than anything else for her son to receive an education and a life that is better than her own.

The History of Bees is an epic novel about the death of the bees. Three stories are interwoven, whereby past, present and future meet. Lunde works on a broad canvas in *The History of Bees*, depicting human beings' initial humble attempts at beekeeping, the industrial agriculture of today and a future where the bees have died. The stories also explore people's relationship to religion, to knowledge and in particular, to nature. *The History of Bees* is a global novel with great relevance in a world where the climate is changing at an increasingly rapid pace. But underlying this theme are three powerful stories about relationships between parents and children. What the three main characters have in common is that they will do anything for their children. They want to facilitate things for them, ensure that their children have lives that are better than their own.


Maja Lunde (b. 1975) is a Norwegian author and screenwriter. She was born and raised in Oslo where she still lives with her husband and three children. Lunde has written four books for children and young adults. She has also written scripts for Norwegian television, including for the children's series *Barnas supershow* ("The Children's Super Show"), the drama series *Hjem* ("Home") and the comedy series *Side om Side* ("Side by Side"). All of these have been great audience successes. *The History of Bees* (2015) is her first novel for adults. It received massive attention when it was first presented at the London Book Fair (Spring 2015), and was sold to seven languages before the book was launched.

Maria, a woman in her 113th year, lives in an old apartment in Barcelona. No one knows that she is Maria Nikolajevna Romanova, the last Russian Tsar's second youngest daughter.

In the autumn of 2012, she meets a Norwegian author who rents an apartment across the hall. Maria finally gets a chance to tell the story of the loss of her family, their grief and their dramatic escape from the Bolsheviks in 1918.

Before Tsar Nicholas the 2nd, his wife and five children were shot one night in July, 1918, they had endured months of captivity and humiliation. The family had thought of themselves as designated by God. They lived in boundless luxury, completely removed from the severe poverty of the Russian people. Their fall was excruciatingly painful, and in the end deadly.



Kari Fredrikke Brænne was born in Oslo, Norway in 1966. She studied art at art academies in Italy, Norway and New York, receiving the Andy Warhol Foundation for the Visual Arts Scholarship. She worked as a fine artist before her debut as a playwright in 2002. Her plays have been performed in theaters throughout Norway.

In 2007, she made her debut as a novelist with *A Different World*, for which she received Aschehoug's Debutant Prize. Her second novel, *Under the Deep Shadows*, has been sold for translation into several languages and has garnered excellent reviews in France, Germany, Austria and Canada.



He is put on sick leave and he embraces the new lifestyle as an opportunity. Simultaneously, all of his interpersonal relationships are put to the test as he sets out to find "the answers".

Helga Flatland's latest novel is about the entitlement generation — Norway's "Me generation" — and her depiction of the expectations of happiness and demands for self-realization of the current age is right on the money. And it is the narrator Andreas who in his mental distress is the voice of this generation.

Helga Flatland has a BA in Nordic languages and literature from the University of Oslo and has completed a three-year copywriter education at Westerdals School of Communication. Her literary debut was with the novel *Stay If You Can. Leave If You Must* (2010), which received enthusiastic reviews. For this novel she was awarded the Tarjei Vesaas' First Book Prize, The Young Critics Award, the Aschehoug First Book Scholarship, and she was nominated for the P2-radio listeners' novel prize. She consolidated her position with *Everyone Wants to Go Home. No One Wants to Go Back* (2011). *There Is No Whole* (2013) concludes the trilogy. Helga Flatland's most recent novel is *Wing Loading* (2015). She is also making her debut as a children's book author with *Eline Plays with Markus* (2015). Helga Flatland is considered one of the foremost up-and-coming, young Norwegian authors. Her manner of describing human processes such as grief, attachment and estrangement has won her a large readership.





For the first time in twenty-five years, he is back in Lillehammer for a friend's funeral. A 40-year old man is forced to look back on something which has plagued him his entire life. His childhood friend Kristoffer is to be buried, and four friends from his adolescence are reunited and forced to confront the painful events that occurred a summer long ago. A girl friend disappeared, and other things went horribly wrong. What have they been involved with? And why does the narrator, Håkon, carry such heavy guilt with him?

Mjåset is a master at conjuring up intense discomfort and a lurking creepy feeling underneath what seems like an average environment. The novel has a suggestive build-up, with fast-paced changes between then (the eighties) and now (burial); that slowly uncovers the brutal truth. At the very end, the plot takes a surprising turn.



Friendship, exile, love, war and art: Johan Harstad's breathtaking new epic has it all.

Max Hansen is sleepless in the Midwest. He is a theatre director on tour across the US. It's possible that he has turned into an American. He hasn't been home for over 20 years.

If it was up to him he would never have left the place he was born, a suburb to Stavanger on the west coast of Norway, where kids could make as much noise as they wanted while their fathers were working on the oil rigs in the North Sea, and where a heavy silence descended on the houses when they returned. But no one gets what they want.

Max, Mischa and the Tet Offensive is a novel about the applicability of Vietnamese guerilla warfare in everyday life, about those who have been to war and those who have demonstrated against them: about hyperrealist paintings of washing machines and girls who look like Shelley Duvall; about the sun out on Fire Island and a sought-after working copy of *Apocalypse Now*. But more than anything this is a novel about the question anyone who has ever left home sooner or later has to ask himself: How long do you have to be away before it becomes too late to go home?

Johan Harstad (b. 1979) offers a wholly original voice and is one of the most obvious talents published by Gyldendal for many years. He made his debut 21 years old, with a contribution to the anthology *Postboks 6860* in 2000, releasing his first collection of prose works, *From here on you just get older*, in 2001. Then followed a collection of short stories, *Ambulance*, in 2002 received with critical acclaim.

In 2005 he published his first novel, *Buzz Aldrin, what happened to you in all the confusion?*, which was later adapted into a TV-series.

Another novel *Hasselby*, followed in 2007. In 2009 Johan Harstad was employed as the first house play write at Norway's Nationaltheatret. He has published two volumes of plays, *BSIDES*, 2008 and *Etc.*, 2010. Translation rights to Harstad's previous titles have been sold to 22 countries.



In 1942 the Jewish courier Ester is betrayed, narrowly avoiding arrest by the Gestapo. In a great haste, she escapes to Sweden, and saves her life. Her family in Oslo is deported to Auschwitz. In Stockholm she meets the resistance hero Gerhard Falkum, who has left his little daughter and fled both the Germans and the suspicion of murdering his wife Åse, who helped Ester get to Sweden. Their burgeoning relationship ends abruptly when Falkum appears to perish in a fire. In 1967 Falkum shows up in Oslo, having been declared dead since 1943. He wants to reconnect with his daughter. But why does he turn up only now, 25 years later? And what is the real reason for his return? The events from the war catch up with Ester. She has also returned to Norway, having worked for the Israeli intelligence since the end of the war. Now she gets new information on Gerhard Falkum, information that forces her to take a new look at her past, and to revive her rusty combat skills.



In 1924, the Norwegian government was forced to enter into a secret agreement giving the Soviet Union control of Svalbard in 2020.

But this document soon went missing under unclear circumstances, and the agreement was forgotten. It resurfaces more than ninety years later. In a time when Europe is standing against an aggressive Russia that wants to be a superpower in the far north of the world. The Russian president implements a comprehensive plan to undermine Norwegian sovereignty in Svalbard. The battle for the Arctic gains a new dimension, and drama unfolds in Longyearbyen.







At Easter 1979 a bag was found on a bus after it had reached its terminus at Sørkedalen outside Oslo. When the driver opened it he found a string vest, a camera, a written and stamped postcard and a passport belonging to a South Korean called Koh Sang-Moon. The driver handed the bag in to the lost property office at Oslo police station, and the case remained unsolved until Sang-Moon inexplicably reappeared several months later on North Korean television propaganda as a defector. After the end of the Korean War, the kidnapping of South Koreans abroad became one of North Korea's most important propaganda weapons against the West.

In *Kim's Games*, journalist Sun Heidi Sæbø follows up the story of the student who brought the major political game between North and South Korea to the little land of Norway. She tracks down Sang-moon's daughter at her home in Seoul and discovers that she has still not given up hope of getting her father back. Sæbø interviews surviving participants in the affair and delves into embassy archives. Last but not least, she speaks with a South Korean who took what to us seems an incomprehensible decision, choosing to leave South Korea for the North. Was it really unthinkable that Koh Sang-Moon moved voluntarily?

This is the gripping and dramatic story of the teen combat interpreter Faizullah Muradi (born 1991). At the age of 17 he was engaged by the Norwegian armed forces in Meymaneh in 2008, showing a false identity paper stating he was 23. Faiz served three years as a combat interpreter. He experienced a huge number of ambushes with Taliban, was only millimetres from deadly machine gun bullets, and saw friends and brothers blown into pieces.

When NATO starts to withdraw their forces in 2011, he had to escape. The Taliban was looking for him. A dramatic flight took him to Greece, and then to Italy.

He then travelled to Norway with the hope that his heavy duty as a combat interpreter might give him some mercy at the authorities. No way! Faiz had to return to Italy where he first was registered and continue his homeless life. But his Norwegian brothers in arms started to act. And finally, the Norwegian prime minister decided to overrule the formalities, and gave Faiz a new chance.

The personal story of interpreter Faizullah Muradi is narrated in a unique voice, close to the Afghan story telling tradition. Through the story, different cultural and political issues in Afghanistan and the situation for refugees in Europe are highlighted. This is narrative non-fiction at its best.







The book includes, for example, in-depth articles about Christians in Lebanon, the Palestinian territories, Egypt and Turkey – areas where Christians today are under extraordinary pressure.

Yet the situation is not equally dire throughout the region. In the Gulf states, for example, there have never been as many Christian churches as there are today, and the number of Christians in these countries is increasing steadily due to employment immigration.

In addition to chapters devoted to selected countries in the region, the book examines such issues as the Islamic State's relationship to Christianity, Muslim-Christian relations through history, cultural exchange between Christians and Muslims – and Norwegians' changing views of Christians in the Middle East.





A theory can be understood as an explanation of a phenomenon, presented as logically coherent statements. If we are to understand and explain anything in or about world, we need a theoretical position. Students at the university level, regardless of field, need to be able to relate to theories and theoretical frameworks; however, "theory" often remains a remote and abstract notion. Theory in practice is an introduction to theoretical considerations around practical qualitative work, particularly textual and social science analysis. The author Jan Grue presents several fundamental questions, such as:

- What is theory?
- Why should we use theories?
- Do non-theoretical explanations of the world exist?
- How can we understand and apply theories in practical academic work?

This book highlights the role of theory and shows why and how theory is relevant in practice. The first part of the book sketches out the basics of understanding theory and theoretically founded analytic concepts, while the second part consists of three concrete examples of theoretical analysis from the fields of health and social sciences, ranging from text via media narratives to social phenomena.



Jan Grue (PhD) is currently a postdoctoral fellow at the University of Oslo's Institute for Sociology and Human Geography, employed under the research project Disease prestige and informal priority settings, primarily grounded in the sociology of health and illness. The book *Disability and Discourse Analysis* is published with Ashgate; it deals with the different ways in which disability is represented across social and political contexts.

His other research interests are chiefly in disability studies and discourse analysis. His PhD thesis is entitled *Interdependent Discourses of Disability: A Critical Analysis of the Social/Medical Model Dichotomy*. He is the managing editor at the Scandinavian Journal of Disability Research and the book review editor of *Rhetorica Scandinavica*.

Most of Grue's (English-language) publications are available through Google Scholar; He is also on academia.edu, ResearchGate and Mendeley, though not very often. Norwegian-language publications are listed in Cristin. Jan Grue publishes frequently in Norwegian and international journals.



This role has in recent years taken him to The House of Commons in London with King's College, The Nordic Horizon and the Scottish Government in Edinburgh, as well as The Young Foundation and Rothschild Foundation, to present his view on the future of gender diversity.
