Ingvild H. Rishøi (b. 1978) made her literary debut in 2007 with Do not Erase, a short story collection which introduced her as a promising new voice in Norwegian literature. Her second collection, The Tale of Mrs Berg (2011), was shortlisted for the prestigious Brage Prize. In 2014, Rishøi received widespread acclaim and popular recognition for the short story collection Winter Stories, which won the Critics' Prize for best adult fiction as well as the Brage Prize for best work of short fiction. Rishøi's debut novel, Brightly Shining (2021) was instantly deemed a modern classic, solidifying her position as one of the Nordic's most revered literary voices. In May 2024, Ingvild H. Rishøi was awarded the very prestigious Dobloug Prize by the Swedish Academy, for her contribution to Norwegian literature.





An author wakes up in hospital. Something dramatic has happened – she just can't quite remember what. What she can recall, however, is what happened before.

When the author moves to Fredrikstad from Oslo with her family, she finds new friends, a new life and what she hopes will be the starting-point for a new novel. Her new girlfriend X has given her permission to write whatever she wants about what they describe as a major issue that has marked X's life. It looks set to be the author's best novel ever, but X gradually becomes increasingly unstable and intimidating, and the author realises that her entire writing project is in jeopardy. Selma Lønning Aarø (b. 1972) made her debut in 1995 with *The Final story* (Den endelige historien), a novel that won her the Cappelen Damm Prize for best debut. Aarø has since written a number books within different genres, both adult and children's fiction, and she is well known for her self ironic and dark sense of humour. Aarø has also been a newspaper columnist for Dagbladet and Klassekampen for a number of years.

Her big breakthrough in Norway came with the novel *Do you want another ride?* (Vil ni åka mera?) in 2003, a novel that brought her a nomination for the Brage Prize. Her novel *I'm coming* (Jeg kommer snart) (2013) has been published in Canada, Germany, Spain and Turkey.

In the novel *Her Lying Face* (Hennes løgnaktige ytre, 2016), Aarø explored the life of writer Anna Munch and her troublesome obsession for Knut Hamsun.





Maria Navarro Skaranger was born in 1994 in Oslo, and made her debut with All the Foreigners Have Their Curtains Closed in 2015, which was sold to Denmark even before its Norwegian publication. Hailed for its prose, a groundbreaking and highly stylized immigrant-influenced Oslo vernacular, the book was nominated for the Tarjei Vesaas First Book Award and also won the Debut Prize 2015.

In 2018 she won much acclaim for her second novel *Book of Grief*, which was awarded the Oslo Prize. In 2019 she became the recipient of the Bjørnson Grant, an author's grant given by the Booksellers' Union, in cooperation with the Authors' Union and the Bjørnson Festival.

A film adaptation of *All the Foreigners Have*Their Curtains Closed premiered in spring 2020.





We are all going to die and before that happens, most of us will grow old. Nobody escapes this fate. Nonetheless, our youth-obsessed culture lacks models enabling us to reconceive and transcend the conventional notions of aging as inevitable decline and death as an anxiety-inducing taboo.

But we can do something about how we choose to understand and engage with these existential conditions. In *Art & Death. A User's Manual*, Kjetil Røed's premise is that art, literature, and philosophy are enormously helpful in this pursuit.

Røed shares the story of his uncle's passing and reflects upon his own evolving awareness of death. He gives the reader thought-provoking and accessible analyses of art, and a piercing criticism of the anxiety about aging and death that is characteristic of our times.

Martin Luther thought she was mad. August Strindberg called her a "satanic bitch".

Saint Bridget (1303-1373) was one of the bravest voices in her time and put both kings and popes in place. Unn Falkeid portrays a Nordic noblewoman who chose to pursue a sacred calling and break away from the life that had been staked out. Bridget gives birth to and raises eight children, then becomes a widow and decides to go to Rome, the center of the church, to ask the pope to return home from his French exile. She receives a stream of visions that are written down and which eventually fill eight volumes.

Saint Bridget left behind a monastic order and the largest authorship ever written by a woman by that time. She was known as "The Swedish Widow". Bridget was canonized after her death, today she is Europe's patron saint. Bridget's dramatic life is a unique story from the European Middle Ages.
